What is "Be WISE"?

Be WISE is a science and math camp designed to develop interest, excitement and self-confidence in girls who are entering grades 7 & 8 in the fall of 2014. This week-long residential camp for 130 girls will be held from June 15-20, 2014. The camp will feature a separate curriculum for each grade level, emphasizing hands-on activities. Class size will be small—just ten students per teacher!
