### **The Eleanor Roosevelt Fund AND Stay-At-Home-Tea**

The AAUW Branch has selected the AAUW Eleanor Roosevelt Fund as the fund to support this year. We must have our contribution to the State Organization by December 15, 2014. We are having a Stay-At-Home Team in honor of Eleanor Roosevelt and her contribution to women. During her life time (Oct, 11, 1884-November 7, 1962 ), she made a difference in the lives of many women.

You may pick up your invitation to celebrate your tea party at the October program. You will be having one of her well known cakes at our October evening program. The recipe will be in the envelop as well as giving directions that will be a tax-deductible donation.

Do you know a woman that has made a difference for women in our area? You may submit a nomination for the 2015 award. The nominee's work should support the goal of AAUW Eleanor Roosevelt Fund: 1) Remove barriers to women's and girls' participation in education, 2) promote the value of diversity and cross cultural communication, 3) develop greater understanding of the ways women learn, think, work and play. The activities must take place in the United States and recipients must reside in the the United States. AAUW state/Branch programs are not eligible. The recipient will receive an award of \$5,000 and travel expenses to attend the 2015 AAUW National Convention in San Diego. The honoree must personally accept the award at convention. ### **Eleanor Roosevelt's Pink Cloud on Angel Food Cake**

#### **CAKE Ingredients:**

1 cup cake flour (sift before measuring)  
1 1/4 cups egg whites (10 or 12)  
1 1/2 teaspoons cream of tartar  
1 1/2 cups sugar  
1/4 teaspoon salt

Sift flour at least twice. Beat egg whites with beater until foamy; add cream of tartar and 1 cup of sugar gradually. Continue beating until egg whites stand up in peaks. Add almond flavoring.

Sift remaining 1/2 cup of sugar with salt and flour, and very carefully fold into egg whites.  
Bake in tube pan in 375 degree oven for 30 to 35 minutes.

#### **PINK CLOUDS Ingredients:**

1 pint strawberries  
1/2 pint heavy cream, whipped  
1/2 cup sugar

Crush berries with sugar. Let stand 30 minutes. Carefully fold berries into whipped cream. Spoon on top of angel food cake.
