HOW TO PLAY IN THE BROWN BAG SILENT AUCTION AT THE PICNIC

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

We are very pleased to announce that MARY LOU THOMPSON has been selected at the 2013 Branch Honoree for the OU-C Scholarship. Congratulations! See Mary Lou receive her award at the September picnic.

At the August Board meeting, a draft budget for the new year was approved. This budget will be distributed with the September *Cap & Gown* and voted upon by the membership at the October meeting. The budget has a positive cash flow, with reserved funds.

We are in the application process for a Branch 501-c-3 non-profit charitable organization status from the IRS. With the approval of our application, we would be able to solicit and receive charitable gifts from members, friends, and grant sources. This has been a dream for a long time and 2013 will be the year we make it happen.

As you know, our Branch retains only \$9 of the membership dues we each pay annually. In drafting Branch goals for 2013, the Board has again included \$1,500 fundraising in addition to the Book Sale proceeds. This additional money will be used for Branch projects beyond scholarships. Because last winter's Wine Tasting event was such a success, raising over \$2,200, we are exploring another "tasting" event. *Chocolate, cheese, or kebobs, perhaps?* More to follow.

REPORT FROM THE LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE AT OTTERBEIN UNIVERSITY *by Karen Rieder*

The AAUW Leadership Conference took place on August 11 at Otterbein College. The discussion involved how an effective leader motivates groups, in any situation. Also included were topical issues such as redistricting and voter suppression and how important every vote is. Also discussed was public policy. Jackie Evangelista is Ohio AAUW's Public Policy Chair and she is seeking a volunteer to handle Public Policy in the S.E. Ohio district - to report on voting records of our representatives. We also had a presenter who spoke about the school voucher system. Seven hundred billion dollars was spent nationwide on vouchers in the past and there is no demand for accountability. The University of Toledo chancellor spoke about diversity and how women are sometimes their own worst enemies. She recommended the book Tripping the Prom Queen (the truth about women and rivalry) by Susan Shapiro Barash. There were also break-out sessions dealing with philanthropy, diversity in membership, developing a web format, and programming for branches.

It was announced that the state convention will be held April 5-7, 2013 at the Newark Metropolitan Hotel in Newark, Ohio with the theme being "An AAUW Tapestry -Weaving the Threads of Engagement, Enrichment and Empowerment". (Editor's Note: Our Branch will be a host of this convention, along with other southeast District branches.)

Exercise Your Right to Vote on Important AAUW Matters

Dear Fellow AAUW Member,

All members can help direct the future of AAUW by participating in our One Member, One Vote process. From now through November 15, 2012, you can propose bylaws amendments and resolutions on our website. Beginning in October, you can also propose changes to the AAUW Public Policy Program. In spring 2013, all members in good standing will be eligible to vote on those proposals and for candidates for national office.

In addition to proposing bylaws amendments, resolutions, and Public Policy Program changes, you can discuss these proposals and share your ideas with others online through our [One Member, One Vote](#) website. And, once the candidates are announced, you will also be able to “meet” them online through biographies, video, and candidate links. Stay tuned for frequent website and other online updates, and watch for important voter information in the upcoming Winter and Spring/Summer issues of *AAUW Outlook*.

In 2013, voting will take place online—because it is fast, easy, secure, and green!—but members may request to have a paper ballot mailed to them if needed. Online voting begins April 15, 2013, and closes at 9 p.m. CDT on June 10, 2013; online voting will also be available at the AAUW National Convention in New Orleans. The request period for paper ballots is April 1, 2013, through May 2, 2013; paper ballots must be postmarked by 11:59 p.m. on May 17, 2013, to be counted.

All members are encouraged to explore the One Member, One Vote site and participate in the discussions about the 2013 election online. Here’s how you can get started: From the AAUW home page, click on [Member Center](#) (in the top right corner), log in with your member ID, and then select [One Member, One Vote](#) from the list on the left. On the same page, you’ll also see a link for [Frequently Asked Questions](#) (FAQ) if you need more information.

You can always find your member ID on the *AAUW Outlook* mailing label or by using the [Member ID Lookup](#) available on the log-in page of the Member Center.

We look forward to your participation in AAUW’s 2013 election!

Program: Summer Dinner Social. Members and guests enjoyed a wonderful Supper Buffet. President Maryjo Flamm-Miller welcomed everyone, introduced the officers and installed the new officers with a candle ceremony. To introduce AAUW to our guests, she highlighted our branch's accomplishments of last year i.e.: Used Book Sale, crocheted necklace sale, Halloween Parade float, sending girls to BE WISE camp, Women's History posters about influential Ross County Women displayed in the libraries, and the college scholarship awarded by our branch. She also outlined our branch goals for next year i.e.: maintain membership, continue awarding scholarships, continue sending girls to BE WISE camp, diversity appreciation as the theme for our monthly programs, September 22, 2012 family picnic, increase our on-line presence (with thanks to and continued reliance on Chrissy Park, Theresa McAuliffe, and Joanna Tsitroulis), put AAUW logo signs back on the organizations fences leading into Chillicothe, and exploring new benefits for members such as links to member businesses on our website. Joyce Atwood, co-chair of the Book Sale reported the dates for sorting the books and the sale and requested members to sign up to help, pointing out the sign-up charts. She also reported that she has Book Sale gift certificates ready for sale. Maryjo Flamm-Miller told our guests about our many study groups and members gave short highlights of each group and when each group meets, i.e.: Dinner Group, Drama Group, Money Smart, Lunch Bunch, Book Club, and Bridge Club.

Guests introduced themselves. Members and guests at each table then discussed questions about women's health based on a hand-out setting out census data and the top five health issues for women: heart disease, breast cancer, osteoporosis, depression and autoimmune diseases. The groups were able to choose between the following questions: "A) Discuss how these health issues cause hardships in women's lives; B) Choose one of the five health concerns; and C) Brainstorm at least three proactive, practical ideas for how women can positively impact their own wellness. After discussion, each group reported on their discussion. These were lively conversations!

President Maryjo Flamm-Miller then highlighted the benefits of membership: branch scholarships for annual dues, and "Give a Grad a Gift" which allows recent graduates to have full membership for just \$9.00. Theresa McAuliffe gave guests each a copy of our branch Yearbook.


POEM BY MEMBER VIRGINIA TAYNOR
