

Program: "Meet Our Mystery Women in Unusual Careers":

Our first speaker was **Sgt. Terri Mikesh**, Canine Training Sergeant of the Crime Patrol of the State Highway Patrol (SHP) told us about her 19 year career with the State Highway Patrol. Canine Training Sergeant is a newly created position. She is the head of all the SHP canine units in Ohio. She is developing state-wide oversight of the canine units and coordinating canine training. This is her second career. Her first career was as a college coach. She played a short video of the crime patrol. She explained that 70 % of crime involves a motor vehicle.

Our second speaker was **Marilyn Moncrieff, Ms. FX IT.** She has her own home repairs business, which she started in 1999. She is married with two grown children; a daughter 23 and a son 20. She was the first woman to graduate from Western Michigan University with a printing degree. She learned home repair from her dad and inherited his tools. She did repairs at Central Center Hardware (then Coast to Coast) for about 11 years. She teaches home maintenance for women at Pickaway-Ross Tech. She volunteers with Habitat for Humanity and leads women builds. She had gone on mission trips to New Orleans to help rebuild after hurricane Katrina. She raises canaries and services two aviaries at Traditions; one in the Heritage and one in the Alzheimer's' Unit. She makes wooden pens and sells them at the Cellar Room. In relation to working in a man's profession, she advised that if you do your job well you will earn the respect of your male co-workers. She gives free consultations.

Business Meeting:

- 1) State Convention: Our branch won several awards: the Daffodil Diversity Award; the AAUW Ohio Certificate of Recognition for excellence in mission based programming local issue focus; and Making Membership Meaningful Award for membership increase. We are now considered a large branch. We made \$166.00 from our 8 auction items. Most branches only brought one auction item. We also sold 17 necklaces and 1 pair of earrings. Karen Rieder signed up for the Leadership Conference held in August. Next years State Convention will be held in southern Ohio and our branch is expected to help with the logistics.

Rita Long moved and Bert Magill seconded that the slate of officers as reported be elected. Motion passed unanimously.

4) **Be WISE Winners:** Bert Magill reported that 6 girls will be attending the Be WISE camp this summer. Member Leslie Van Volkinburg suggested that all the girls that applied be notified as soon as possible about whether or not they have been selected for the scholarship, to allow those not selected time to apply for and pay for the camp on their own and also to thank them for applying and encouraging them to reapply the next year.

- 5) **Summer Social:** The Summer Social is set for Thursday, July 26, 2012 at 6:45 p.m. at the Child Development Center of Ohio University-Chillicothe. Member Rita Long suggested that we put information about AAUW and an invitation to our Summer Social in with the diplomas of the women graduating from OU-C. Also, suggested putting an invitation to our Summer Social on the OU-C blog.
- **6) Announcements:** It was announced that Rosemary Houf is moving to upstate New York to be closer to her daughter. The 2012 Book Sale organizational meeting will be held on Monday, April 30, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. at the Child Development Center, OU-C. The Summer Social organizational meeting will be held Thursday, May 3, 2012 at 3:30 p.m. at the Child Development Center, OU-C.

Next Meeting: Our next meeting will be held on Thursday, May 24, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. at Madison on the Lake. This will be our Diamond Jubilee Celebration Dinner. Car pooling will be organized.
